

2009 UTAH STATE HIGH POWER RIFLE REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

DATE: November 7-8, 2009.

TIME: 0800 hrs

LOCATION: Green River, Utah.

DIRECTIONS: See map and directions at www.usrpa.org.

FACILITIES: Many hotels in local area. The range has porta potties only. Competitors should bring their own food and water,

RULES: Current NRA HIGH POWER Rifle Rules will govern.

ELIGIBILITY: This is a Registered Match open to any individual who has shot in at least one prior approved or registered match. Junior competitors may be individual members of the NRA or a member of an NRA affiliated Junior Rifle Association.

CLASSIFICATION: Competitors holding an NRA classification will shoot in their respective classes. All unclassified shooters will shoot in the Master class (Rule 19.2). Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6), or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.2), may be used in making entry in this match.

REGISTRATION: Entries will be limited to the first 40 competitors to register. Registration cards are available online at http://www.usrpa.org/High_Power/high_power.html. All pre-registrations must be received on or before Wednesday, November 4, 2009. Late registrations will be accepted at the range up to range capacity prior to squadding at 07:45. A late registration fee of \$5.00 will be charged.

REGISTRATION LIMITED: Entries will be limited to the first 60 competitors to register.

FEES:

Total entry fees are as follows:

Adult \$50.00 (\$45 if received by Nov. 4th).

Junior (Under 21) \$25.00 (\$20 if received by Nov. 4th).

Fees for Match 8 (EIC) is \$25.00 for everyone.

Challenge fee: \$2.00

\$5.00 of your registration fee will be paid to the Green River Shooting Sports Park for range use.

TIME: Firing will commence immediately following squadding.

SOUVENIR PINS: Will be given to each individual competitor.

SQUADDING: Squadding cards will be available on Saturday, November 7, 2008 from 0745 to 0800 at the range.

EMPTY CHAMBER INDICATOR: The use of an empty chamber indicator is mandatory (Rule 3.21). They are available for \$1.00 at the range.

RIFLE: NRA Match Rifle (Rule 3.3); or Service Rifle (Rule 3.1, 3.1.1, or 3.1.2)

SIGHTS: Metallic only (Rule 3.7a). (Optics may be used, but the competitor is not eligible for awards or titles).

TARGETS: 200 yards - SR target; 300 yards - SR-3 target; 600 yards Prone – MR.

TARGET PULLERS: No target pullers will be provided. Each competitor will pull targets unless a suitable substitute is approved in advance by the Match Director. Those competitors who fail to perform their pit duties will be disqualified.

SIGHTING SHOTS: Two sighting shots will be allowed for each fired match. Sighting shots which are allowed for each match must be taken and scored. Sighting shots may be taken in a position other than specified for the match, but such position must be one of those described in Rule 5 excluding Rule 5.13.

SCORING: Competitors will score for each other. Those competitors who fail to perform their scoring duties may be disqualified.

COURSE OF FIRE: 0800, SATURDAY

MATCH 1: 200 Yards Standing. 2 sighting shots, 20 shots for record, 22 minutes. (Rule 5.12).

MATCH 2: 200 Yards Rapid Fire. Standing to sitting or kneeling, 2 sighting shots, two 10 shot strings (Rule 5.8 or 5.10), 60 sec./string.

MATCH 3: 300 Yards Rapid Fire. Prone from standing, 2 sighting shots, two 10 shot strings (Rule 5.6), 70 sec./string.

MATCH 4: 600 Yards Slow Fire. Prone, 2 sighting shots, 20 shots for record (Rule 5.6), 22 minutes.

MATCH 5: Slow Fire Aggregate. An aggregate of the scores fired in Matches 1 and 4.

MATCH 6: Rapid Fire Aggregate. An aggregate of the scores fired in Matches 2 and 3.

MATCH 7: Regional Championship. An aggregate of scores fired in Matches 5, and 6.

NOTE-THE 200 RAPID FIRE MATCH WILL BE FIRED IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE 200 YARD STANDING MATCH BEFORE A RELAY CHANGE WILL OCCUR.

REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS:

WINNER: NRA Regional Gold Medallion.

2ND PLACE: NRA Regional Silver Medallion.

3RD PLACE: NRA Regional Bronze Medallion.

AWARD SCHEDULE: There must be 5 or more entries in a class for an award. Competitors may be combined with the next higher class when there are less than 5 competitors per class. If there are fewer than 5 High-Masters entered, they will fire for overall awards only. The Master class will not be combined with the High-Master class. Awards will be provided for overall 1st, 2nd and 3rd places, as well as High Senior, High Junior, and High Woman. Class winners will also receive an award.

CMP SERVICE RIFLE MATCH: 0800, SUNDAY, November 8, 2009. (Service Rifle Only)

TIME: This MATCH will commence at on this range as set forth above.

LIABILITY WAIVER: A signed, and Notarized "**Eligibility Affidavit and Liability Agreement**" must be presented or on file to be eligible to compete in the EIC match.

RULES: This match is governed by the rules prescribed by the Civilian Marksmanship Program (see Competition Rules and Regulations - current ed.).

OPEN TO: Any citizen of the United States 16 years of age or older. However, younger competitors may compete with the Match Director's permission. Distinguished shooters are eligible to compete for place awards only. However, if range facilities limit the number of entries which can be accepted, priority will be given to non-distinguished competitors.

COURSE OF FIRE: 0800, SUNDAY - National Match Course (no sighting rounds).

First Stage- Slow Fire, 200 yards; target, short range competitive. 10 shots standing; 1 minute per shot. Sling on rifle and in the parade position.

Second Stage- Sustained Fire, 200 yards; target, SR. 10 shots, sitting or kneeling from standing; 60 seconds firing time.

Third Stage- Sustained Fire, 300 yards; target, SR3. 10 shots, prone from standing; 70 seconds firing time.

Fourth Stage- Slow Fire, 600 yards; target, MR1. 20 shots, prone; 1 minute per shot.

RIFLE: As described in paragraph 4-11, CMP Competition Rules and Regulations (current ed.)

1. US Rifle, Caliber .30 M1, as issued by the US Army, or the same type of commercially manufactured rifle or modified with a 7.62 cal. barrel, having not less than a 4.5 pound trigger pull, with standard type stock and standard issue type leather or web sling.

2. US Rifle, Caliber 7.62 M14 or the same type and caliber of commercially manufactured rifle, having not less than a 4.5 trigger pull with standard type stock and standard type leather or web sling. In all courses of fire and in all positions the 20 round box magazine will be attached.

3. US Rifle, Caliber 5.56mm M16 series or the same type commercially manufactured rifle, without bipod or grenade launcher, having not less than a 4.5 pound trigger pull, with standard type stock, pistol grip, hand guard, and leather or web sling. In all courses of fire and in all positions the standard 20 round box magazine will be used.

AMMUNITION: No ammunition will be provided. All competitors must furnish their own ammunition.

LEG MATCH AWARDS: The EIC (Leg) Match awards will be mailed to the recipients by the Civilian Marksmanship Program, Port Clinton, Ohio.
