- Facilities:** Many hotels in local area
NOTE: Competitors should bring their own food and water. A porta-a-pottie will be located behind the 600 yd line.

- Time:** Firing will commence following squadding assignments at 0800. The gate will be accessible at 0700.

- Liability Waiver:** Current range liability insurance requires a signed liability waiver be on file for each match participant. A Waiver of Liability form can be downloaded online at: http://www.usrpa.org/High Power/high_power.html
This is a mandatory requirement to be eligible to compete in these matches.
- Rules:** Current NRA HIGH POWER Rifle Rules will apply.
- Eligibility:** This is a Registered Match open to any individual who is a member of the Utah State Rifle & Pistol Association or their respective State Associations, who has shot in at least one prior High Power Rifle Match. A \$5.00 nonmember fee for this match will be charged for those without proof of current Utah State Rifle & Pistol Association membership or membership in their respective State Associations. USRPA membership is \$25 per year. Applications will be available at the range. (\$15.00 for juniors).
- Classification:** Competitors holding an NRA High Power Rifle & Mid Range classification will shoot in their respective classes. All unclassified shooters will shoot in the Master Class (Rule 19.2). Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6), or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.2) may be used in making entry in this match.
- Registration Limited:** Entries will be limited to the first 60 competitors to register. All pre-registrations must be received by the Monday before the match. Late registrations will be accepted at the range prior to the squadding at 0730, up to range capacity.

Open Bolt Indicator: The use of an open bolt indicator is mandatory (Rule 3.21). They are available for \$1.00 from the match director.

Rifle Categories: Thursday: Palma Rifle, Service Rifle, Any Rifle/Any Sight, F-class TR, and F-class Open.
Friday: Palma Rifle, Service Rifle, Any Rifle/metallic Sight, F-class TR, and F-class Open.
Saturday: NRA Match Rifle (Rule 3.3); Service Rifle (Rule 3.1, 3.1.1, or 3.1.2)
Sunday: Service Rifle (see rules listed under Sunday's match)

Targets: Thursday & Friday Matches: 600 yd - MR.
Saturday & Sunday Matches: 200 yd - SR target., 300 yd - SR-3 target., 600 yd Prone - MR
Sunday Match: 200 yd - SR target., 300 yd - SR-3 target., 600 yd Prone - MR

Target Pullers: No Target pullers will be provided. Each competitor will pull targets unless a suitable substitute is approved by the Match Director. Those competitors who fail to perform their pit duties will be disqualified.

Scoring: Competitors will score for each other. Those competitors who fail to perform their scoring duties may be disqualified.

Course of Fire:

Thursday: Match 1: Any Rifle / Any Sight. Unlimited sighting shots, 20 shots for record, 600 yds., time 30 minutes. 2 sighters and 20 shots for record, 600 yds., time 22 minutes. 2 sighters and 20 shots for record, 600 yds., time 22 minutes.

Friday: Match 2: Any Rifle / Metallic Sight. Unlimited sighting shots, 20 shots for record, 600 yds., time 30 minutes. 2 sighters and 20 shots for record, 600 yds., time 22 minutes. 2 sighters and 20 shots for record, 600 yds., time 22 minutes.

Match 3: The Utah State Mid Range Regional Championship: An aggregate of the scores fired in match #1 & #2.

Saturday:

Match 4: 200 Yards Standing. 2 sighting shots, 20 shots for record (Rule 5.12), 22 minutes.

Match 5: 200 Yards Rapid Fire. Sitting or Kneeling, 2 sighting shots, two 10 shot strings (Rule 5.8 or 5.10), 60 sec./string.

Match 6: 300 Yards Rapid Fire. Prone, 2 sighting shots, two 10 shot strings (Rule 5.6), 70 sec./string

Match 7: 600 Yards Slow Fire. Prone, 2 sighting shots, 20 shots for record (Rule 5.6), 22 minutes.

Match 8: Slow Fire Aggregate. An aggregate of the scores fired in Matches 4 and 7.

Match 9: Rapid Fire Aggregate. An aggregate of the scores fired in Matches 5 and 6.

Match 10: The Utah State Highpower Regional Championship: An aggregate of scores fired in match 8 and 9.

NOTE: The 200 rapid fire match will be fired immediately following the 200 yard standing match before a relay change will occur.

Sunday:

Conditions governing Sunday EIC Match

Time and Place:

The CMP Service Rifle (EIC) Match will commence at 0800 on June 6, 2010 on this range.

Liability Waiver:

A signed and notarized "**Eligibility Affidavit and Liability Agreement**" must be presented or on file to be eligible to compete in this EIC Match. This can be downloaded on line at: <http://www.usrpa.org/High Power/high power.html>

Rules:

This match is governed by the rules prescribed by the Civilian Marksmanship Program (See Competition Rules and Regulations - current ed.).

Open To:

Any citizen of the United States 16 years of age or older. However, younger competitors may compete with the Match Director's permission. Distinguished shooters are eligible to compete for place awards only. However, if range facilities limit the number of entries which can be accepted, priority will be given to non-distinguished competitors.

Course of Fire:

First Stage: Slow Fire, 200 yards; target, shot range competitive. 10 shots standing; 1 minute per shot. Sling on rifle and in the parade position.

Second Stage: Sustained Fire, 200 yards; target, SR. 10 shots, sitting or kneeling from standing; 60 seconds firing time.

Third Stage: Sustained Fire, 300 yards; target, SR3. 10 shots, prone from standing; 70 seconds firing time

Fourth Stage: Slow Fire, 600 yards; target, MR1. 20 shots, prone; 1 minute per shot.

NOTE: The 200 rapid fire match will be fired immediately following the 200 yard standing match before a relay change will occur.

Rifles:

As described in paragraph 4-11, CMP Competition Rules and Regulations (current ed.)

- 1 US Rifle, Caliber .30 M1, as issued by the US Army, or the same type of commercially manufactured rifle or modified with a 7.62 cal. Barrel, having not less than a 4.5 pound trigger pull, with standard type stock and standard issue type leather or web sling.
- 2 US Rifle, Caliber 7.62 M14 or the same type and caliber of commercially manufactured rifle, having not less than a 4.5 pound trigger pull with standard type stock and standard type leather or web sling. In all courses of fire and in all positions the 20 round box magazine will be used.
- 3 US Rifle, Caliber 5.56 mm M16 series or the same type commercially manufactured rifle, without bipod or grenade launcher, having not less than a 4.5 pound trigger pull, with standard type stock, pistol grip, hand guard, and leather or web sling. In all courses of fire and in all positions the standard 20 round box magazine will be used.

Ammunition:

No ammunition will be provided. All competitors must furnish their own ammunition.

Awards:

Monetary awards will be given to each Match Winner and to the high individuals in each division Category/Class award group separately for the Mid Range Regional on Thursday and Friday; and then separately for the High Power Regional on Saturday in accordance with a schedule. Award groups must contain a minimum of 5 competitors or they will be combined with the next appropriate award group per policy. Second, third, fourth place, etc... awards will be given based on one award for each five (5) competitors. If there are fewer than 5 high masters entered, they will fire for overall awards only. The Master class will not be combined with the high master class. The F-class (s) will not be combined with any other class. If there are not enough entries for class awards, awards will only be given out to the overall top three shooters per match. Awards for the EIC match will be mailed by the CMP to the respective recipients.
